

April 2022 Board Meeting

1. Call Meeting to Order at 5:01 PM in the Los Altos Banquet Room

Roll Call-Chad Padilla, Gerry Quinlan, Paul Todesco, Wally Iverson, Dan Turnham, Paul Bernier, Bob Bowman, Jerry Simon, Jim Riker.

2. Minutes from March Meeting- motion to approve from Jerry Simon, second by Gerry Quinlan. Unanimous vote to approve.

3. Vice-President/Membership Report- 341 members currently, 38 new members, 14 reinstatements who were not members in 2021.

4. Treasurer's Report- motion to approve from Dan, seconded from Bob, unanimously approved.

5. Duffer Editor's Report/Deadline- Chad has pictures for the next issue.

6. Web Page Report- none

7. Wednesday Chairman's Report- Things going smoothly with no problems. Took week off during top-dressing. 27 tee times today, 10 on Thursday. We have an offer from ACC to play there at the same cost as Los Altos.

8. Golf Advisory Report- Practice green much improved. Aeration done without plugging, due to condition of greens. Purchase order has been placed for netting for #14. Outdoor seating coming for restaurant. Improvements for drain on #8. There is discussion about lighting for the parking lot. The fence on #2 does not go all the way to the ground, so balls can get underneath and go OB. Wally says that in the past, dirt has been graded up against the bottom to prevent this.

9. Handicap Chairman's Report- A member dropped out of tournaments because he couldn't play the golds with the same handicap as the whites.

10. Tournament Chairman's Report- Website is set up for registration for May tournament. Format is two-man best ball / scramble. A member who is currently a professional wants to play. There was discussion followed by a vote to not allow it until he regains amateur status.

11. Old Business- Golf Genius emails are going out to over 400 persons, including inactives. Wally said they would be purged from Golf Genius. 22 valid emails are being rejected. Some discussion followed on possible reasons.

12. New Business- there was discussion about raking of bunkers, whether rakes should be left in bunkers, and the quality of the rakes. Some bunkers have no rakes, others have several. A short discussion followed on the yardage stakes in the fairways and what the ruling is if a ball hits one. Relief may be taken if a stake interferes with stance or swing, but a ball that hits a stake must

be played from where it ends up. Everyone agreed that the stakes are unnecessary as there are stone yardage markers set in the fairways, and vegetation for 150 and 200 yards.
